now freely available to GED students throughout the state. A multitude of GED preparation activities are offered through powerful online programs, including GED Connection, keytrain, Instruction Targeted for TABE Success (ITTS), PreGED Online, and GEDPathway.

providing trained mentors who will prepare an individualized learning plan for every student. Students work on the skills they need, using the programs that are right for them. Mentors also provide counseling and technical assistance to students as they move through their online lessons. Finally, eLearn Virginia will monitor student progress and communicate this information to local adult education programs and teachers, in order to determine the best learning options for each student.

- an email address
- basic computer skills *and*
- a willingness to work at least 3 hours a week on their online lessons
